

Appendix 1.2: Guide to Locating 40 CFR § 51.308 Requirements

§ 51.308(c) Regional Planning

Chapter 3 of this SIP describes Kansas's ongoing participation in the regional planning process.

§ 51.308(d)(1) Reasonable Progress Goals

Kansas set reasonable progress for achieving the State's share of emission reductions required at Class I areas impacted by Kansas sources. The technical documentation and required controls are outlined in Chapter 10.

§ 51.308(d)(2) Calculations of baseline and natural visibility conditions

Kansas does not contain any Class I areas. A general discussion of visibility can be found in Chapter 5.

§ 51.308(d)(3) Long-term strategy for regional haze

States must develop a long-term strategy for reducing regional haze and visibility impairment in the Class I areas. Kansas's long-term strategy is laid out in Chapter 12.

§ 51.308(d)(4) Monitoring strategy and other implementation plan requirements

States must have a monitoring strategy for measuring and reporting on regional haze visibility impairment. Kansas's monitoring strategy is detailed in Chapter 6.

§ 51.308(e) BART requirements for regional haze visibility impairment

Regional haze SIPs must include BART emissions limits and schedules of compliance for affected sources. All information on Kansas' BART sources are found in Chapter 9.

§ 51.308(f) Requirements for comprehensive periodic revisions of implementation plans

States must commit to periodic revisions of the regional haze SIP to ensure that the requirements are being met. Kansas's plan for these periodic revisions is laid out in Chapter 13.

§ 51.308(g) Requirements for periodic reports describing progress towards reasonable progress goals

Kansas's plan for periodic reports describing the visibility improvement towards meeting the reasonable progress goal is described in Chapter 13.

§ 51.308(h) Determination of the adequacy of the existing implementation plan

Each state is required to submit reports on the adequacy of the existing implementation plan for improving visibility; this requirement is covered in Chapter 14.

§ 51.308(i) State and Federal Land Manager Coordination

Kansas has coordinated with Federal Land Managers (FLMs) through participation in the regional planning process; this is documented in Chapter 3. Kansas also consulted with the FLMs individually and during the required comment period. This requirement is addressed in Chapter 4, with FLM comments and Kansas's responses provided in Appendix 4.1.
